Kimbra Suzanne Wilder Gish, 46, of Henderson, Kentucky passed away peacefully on Wednesday, April 7, 2020 surrounded by family at the Lucy Smith King Care Center of St. Anthony's Hospice. She was born August 5, 1973, in Middlesboro, Kentucky, the daughter of Lonnie and Helen Wilder. A 1991 graduate of Middlesboro High School, she completed a B.A. degree in English at Lincoln Memorial University in 1995 and a M.S. degree with ALA credentials in Library and Information Science in 1996 at the University of Tennessee. She was awarded an internship at the Eskind Biomedical Library of Vanderbilt University Medical Center. Upon completion, she was invited to join the library staff and worked there a number of years as a Biomedical Librarian until moving to Henderson. She also enjoyed writing.

While volunteering at Camp Horizon, a camp for kids with cancer near Nashville, Tennessee, she met Darren Gish of Henderson, a volunteer counselor there. She will be greatly missed by her husband, Darren Gish of Henderson; her parents, Helen and Lonnie Wilder of Middlesboro; mother-in-law, Kay Gish of Henderson and brother-in-law, Jeff Gish of Evansville, Indiana; two special uncles, Don and Paul Wilder of Harrogate, Tennessee; a special aunt and uncle, Mary and Fred Yeary of Charlotte, North Carolina; and a special cousin she grew up with, James Carey of Cleveland, Ohio.
