He drove a firetruck for many years before going to work at Firestone/Accuride, where he drove a fork truck.

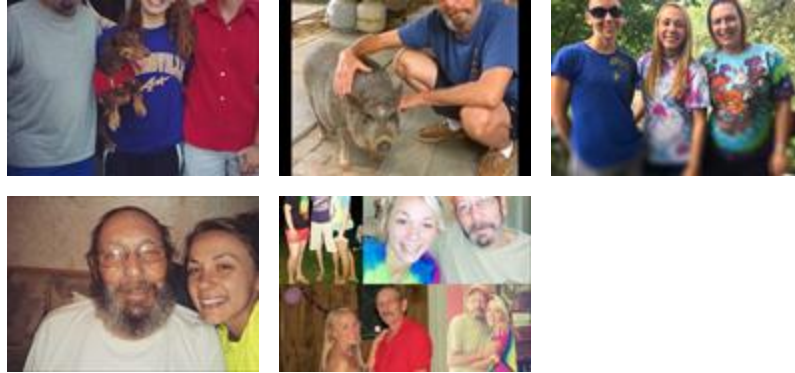
He will be missed, I am sure. My condolences to his loved ones. Praying for God's comforting peace to envelope you all!
